This month we are announcing the dates for our band, solo/duo and youth competitions. The band contest will be June 26 at Stevie Ray's, the solo/duo contest is August 14 at Zeppelin Cafe and the youth contest is scheduled for October 16 at Willis Music on Hurstbourne Pkwy. The winners will represent the Kentuckiana Blues Society at the International Blues Challenge in Memphis next year. See the ad in this issue of *Blues News*. In this issue we have listed those festivals in our area that will feature blues music in 2011. The schedules are set for both June festivals – the Germantown-Schnitzelburg Blues Festival in Louisville and the Smokin' on the River Blues and BBQ Festival in Jeffersonville, IN. The festival in the Germantown-Schnitzelburg neighborhood is the first weekend in June and will feature music by Sue O'Neil and Blue Seville, Dog House Kitchen, Hellfish, the Travlin Mojoes, the Joe DeBow Band and Lamont Gillispie and 100 Proof. The Jeffersonville festival is the third weekend in June at the Riverstage and will feature Jimmy G and Sidewinders, the KingBees, the Walnut Street Blues Band, the Amazing Soul Crackers, Miss Lissa and Company, the Predators and Smokin' Joe Kubek and Bnois King. The festival will also have music courtesy of students from Jimmy's Music Center in New Albany and MOM's Music Rock School. We will have more information on both festivals in future issues of *Blues News* and on the KBS website.

Louisville Public Media, the parent company of WFPK, WFPL and WUOL, will have it's spring fund drive from Saturday, April 9 through Friday, April 15. Members of the KBS board will be at the station on Saturday night April 9th from 9:00 pm to midnight working the phones and taking pledges. Community support of our local public radio stations is especially important at a time when Congress is debating the elimination of funding for NPR. Please help us support public radio during the fund drive and call in when the blues society is volunteering during Kevin Yazell's Rolling Stones Hour and Saturday Night Blues Party. 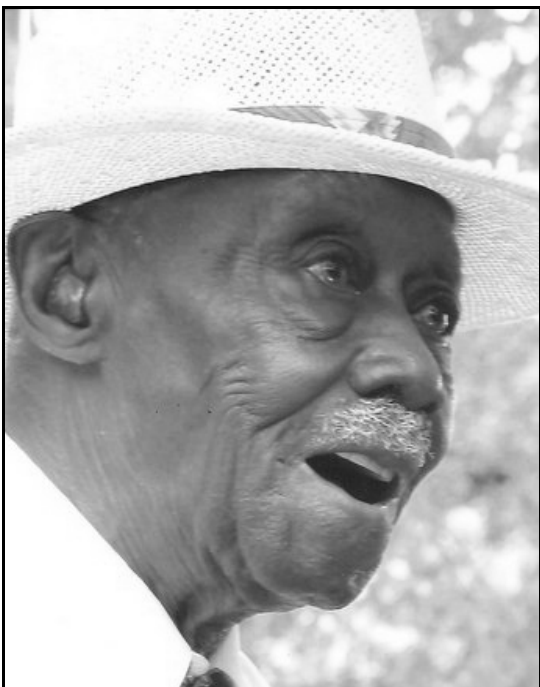


Photo of Pinetop Perkins at the 2008 Chicago Blues Festival by Keith S. Clements

Joseph William "Pinetop" Perkins July 7, 1913 - March 21, 2011

Winner of three Grammys and twelve *consecutive* Blues Music (WC Handy) Awards, boogie-woogie piano icon Pinetop Perkins passed away at his Austin home on March 21st of cardiac arrest. Pinetop was one of the last of the generation who learned the music first hand in juke joints and at house parties rather than from recordings. He recorded a few original tunes and interpreted blues standards from such singers as Ivory Joe Hunter, Louis Jordan, Leroy Carr and Howlin' Wolf. Sideman to such legendary artists as Muddy Waters, Sonny Boy Williamson and B.B. King, Perkins never had a solo album until the release of "**After Hours**" on Blind Pig Records in 1988. The tour in support of that album also featured Jimmy Rogers and Hubert Sumlin. Just last month Pinetop became the oldest performer ever to win a Grammy. At age 97, he won for Best Traditional Blues Album, "**Joined at the Hip**", which he recorded with Willie "Big Eyes" Smith. "I remember the days when I played at chicken fights and your only pay was the dead chicken," he once told the New York Times. "But now I can't retire even if I want to. Everybody's calling me." His booking agent, Hugh Southard, recalled in an interview that the long-lived bluesman's performance contract called for two double cheeseburgers, two apple pies and a medium Sprite from McDonald's. For the record, he got his name from the song "Pinetop's Boogie Woogie" (which was written and originally performed by Pinetop *Smith*)...not the other way around!

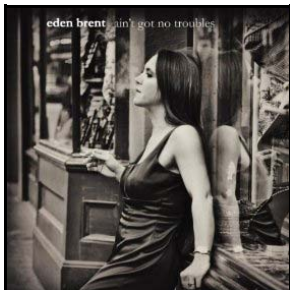

New Music Reviews!



Ain't Got No Troubles
Eden Brent
Yellow Dog Records

Eden Brent's boogie piano and whiskey-smoked voice carry 12 tunes on her new CD, which fuse gritty and rootsy elements with an unmistakable New Orleans flavor where Brent seems to have truly found a new home.

Produced by Colin Linden in the Crescent City, the Mississippi native's second release on the Yellow Dog label is energetic, yet relaxed in a way only New Orleans-influenced music can be. Brent seems to truly be having fun, and the whole recording evokes scenes of good times in a

corner bar.

Brent's sweet southern drawl and talented hands could cause comparisons to be made. Press materials include her "Bessie Smith meets Diana Krall meets Janis Joplin attitude," and then reference both Norah Jones and Sarah Vaughn. One thing for sure: she's memorable.

Credit must also be given to Linden, whose production work is becoming legendary in some circles. He lends some tasty slide guitar to the instrumental mix and in general did an excellent job in presenting, and executing, the overall mood and tone of this CD. Of course, Brent is always out front, just where she needs to be.

There are only excellent tunes on this CD, although a few bear mentioning. The title track, one of eight written by Brent, is the quintessential New Orleans good-times song. However, the piano-driven opener "Someone to Love" really sets the tone for the rest of the set list. Every appropriate ingredient that could be included for this song creates a perfect recipe for a great listening experience. It's bouncy, up-tempo, has some nice piano solos and features Brent's great sense of rhythm and vocal delivery. Track three ("Blues All Over") is old-time, toe-tappin' piano blues at its best, and Brent even occasionally stretches her voice to a tiny growl on occasion. And "Let's Boogie-Woogie" well, let's just say Jerry Lee couldn't do it any better.

One thing more about this great recording: If she's this good in the studio, it's probably a safe bet she's also a great live performer as well.

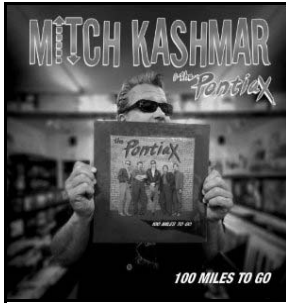

100 Miles To Go
Mitch Kashmar & The Pontiax
Delta Groove Productions

Before Mitch Kashmar's rise to fame with his hit 2005 Delta Groove CD "Nickels and Dimes", in fact WELL before that, circa 1989, he was a member of a band called The Pontiax. The Pontiax played around southern California including the LA area. While there, he played with James Harmon, Kid Ramos, and Hollywood Fats, Rod Piazza, Kim Wilson, and others. He also recorded with William Clarke, and Jimmy Morrello. The music on this CD was recorded in that era and has now been re-released by Delta Groove. Randy Chortkoff, a fellow "harp dog" as Kashmar refers to him, and founder of Delta Groove, decided to include the original songs and 2 new bonus tracks recorded by the reunited original band.

Anyone unfamiliar with Kashmar should know that he is an excellent singer and harmonica player. The rest of the Pontiax are Bill Flores on guitar and tenor sax, Jon Lawton on guitar, Jack Kennedy on bass, and Tom Lackner on drums.

The first 10 songs on the CD are the original recording from 1989. Every one of these tunes is excellent. I must say that the original recordings were done very well and captured a great west coast blues sound in the vein of Hollywood Fats or Rod Piazza.

After listening to the original music, I wish they had recorded more. After listening to the new songs, I wish they would record more new songs too.

I last reviewed Kashmar's music on his CD "Live at Labatt", released in 2008. On that CD, one of the original band members, Tom Lackner performs. Kashmar only sees his former band members occasionally, but was delighted to get together with them for this recording. One of the new songs "Petroleum Blues" is a protest song of sorts that links our dependence on fossil fuels to the current wars in the Mideast, implying that it is all about the oil.

This CD comes highly recommended by me. It is one of the best this year. Visit www.deltagrooveproductions.com for a sound clip or two.

Have Blues, Will Travel
Smokin' Joe Kubek and Bnois King
Alligator Records

These two always give us a good blues CD. Their last, "Blood Brothers", was also a keeper for me. Smokin' Joe Kubek and Bnois King wrote all twelve songs and Kubek produced this album with Bruce Iglauer. My favorite cuts are "RU4 Real?", and "Payday in America", but all are good blues. The guitar playing is great, with Kubek on lead, slide and rhythm guitars. King does the vocals and also plays lead and rhythm guitar. John Morrison on bass and Adrian Marchi on drums round out this blues band, along with Gary Long on cowbells on "Out of Body, Out of Mind". The CD opens with the title song, "Have Blues, Will Travel".

Recorded and mixed by Sterling Winfield at Nomad Recording Studios in Carrollton, Texas...less than five miles from my Dallas house.

Chasin' Tail
Anni Piper
Blues Leaf Records

First, read the CD liner notes. This is a BLUES newsletter. So, read the liner notes before listening to this CD. There's a strong hint in there of what you'll hear. This Aussie blues music award-winner writes: "Thanks to...John Durr--for letting me be a rock chick this time around..."

Whoever Mr. Durr is, he must've had some say in this recording's musical direction, although he is not listed on the main credits. The photo on the front cover also clues you in on Ms. Piper's instrument of choice: bass. Her other main "instrument" is her big, rich, full-bodied voice.

Eight of these 11 tunes are Piper originals, or at least co-written with guitarist Sam Buckley--who is quite skilled and adds some wicked slide to the mix on at least one tune. More about that in a moment. The other half of the rhythm section is drummer Reuben Alexander. This is a simple, three-piece band playing uncomplicated rock music with a heavy blues influence.

This reviewer's notes, track for track, include phrases like "blues rock" "funk blues" "slow blues rock" and "Hendrix"--oops. The final track is a Hendrix cover ("Voodoo Child--Slight Return").

All the tunes are pretty good--oddly enough, two of the best from the list are not Piper originals. "If You Be My Baby" (Adams/Green) is a gritty blues rocker which showcases Piper's great voice. "Hideaway" is a 1, 4, 5-chord progression toe-tapper reminiscent of Elmore James. The best tune is at track three. "The Whistleblower," (Piper) is a real blues-rock stomp featuring some well-played slide by Buckley.

Strong blues influence, with some true blues tunes. However, Ms. Piper was correct in her thank-you's. Someone "allowed" her to be a real rocker chick this time around. Not bad, but not all 100% blues, either.

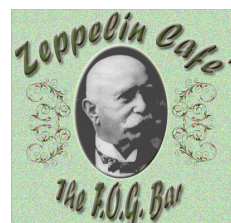
